

#### 1. Report on Workshop I

The first training workshop took place on October 13-15, 2015 in Belgrade, Serbia, in the frame of the SEEDS project.

The agenda of the workshop included (the Annex I includes the full Agenda):

- Presentation of UK Data Archive and Services;
- Presentations of OAIS;
- Presentations of Policy and Procedures Documents;
- Presentations and discussion of reports on evaluation or research and legal conditions in Albania, Kosovo, Macedonia and Montenegro;
- Starting discussion and hands-on Establishment plans preparation and Policy and procedure documents;
- Discussion about cooperation with RRPP and
- Planning next steps.

On the first day (13 October) Hilary Beedham began with an overview of the UK Data Archive and with a description of the services that it supports including infrastructure, capacity and skills. Bojana Tasić and Irena Vipavc Brvar continued with presentations regarding OAIS in details, and at the end of the day Brian Kleiner, Aleksandra Bradić-Martinović and Marijana Glavica presented existing Policy and Procedures documents in Serbian and Croatian prototype of data archives. The objective of the first day was to provide additional knowledge for new partners about all relevant topics needed for establishment of data archive in social sciences.

The second day (14 October) was mainly dedicated to reports on evaluation or research and legal conditions. Participants from new partner countries presented the results of mapping and analysis of existing potentials for the establishment of a social science digital data archives in Albania, Kosovo, Macedonia and Montenegro. At the end of the second day participants from new partner countries, with the support of CESSDA partners and old partner countries, started to fill in the elements of the establishment plans. Basically, they brainstormed about the identity of the new organizations, the scope of collections, the potential set of services, governance structures, stakeholders and partner institutions, and potential organizational charts. The first day finished with discussion about the initial versions of the establishment plans. General conclusions point out that new partner countries should continue construction of establishment plans within their institutions and with support of their managements and stakeholders.

The third day (15 October) was dedicated to discussion about cooperation with RRPP (Regional Research Promotion Programme - http://www.rrpp-westernbalkans.net/). Brian Kleiner proposed project "RRPP Data Rescue" to all SEEDS partners. This project has the objective to ensure long-term preservation of and access to data produced within the RRPP projects. These data are collected in each country involved in the SEEDS project, and so the final benefit of this project would be double. First, the data will be safeguarded, discoverable, and usable by the larger scientific community, and the second, the partners within the SEEDS project will have datasets and descriptions prepared for new archives.

The main issue regarding this project is the short deadline, end of December 2016. The partners have concerns about that, having in mind that it would be a parallel activity to the SEEDS project. At the end of the discussion we agree to start with this initiative and to work on at least one or two datasets with value in the sense of interest, sufficient documentation and good contact with researchers who collected it. Brian Kleiner will continue negotiations with RRPP and will contact colleagues from Bosna and Herzegovina in order to include them in the new project initiative.

The end of the workshop was dedicated to next steps within the SEEDS project. We agreed to swap second and third workshops. According to the proposal we are supposed to organize Workshop II in Zagreb. This workshop should cover data solicitation and curation of both quantitative and qualitative data, and there will be presentation and discussion of best practices and standards regarding data preparation and documentation, including the international metadata standard DDI (Data Documentation Initiative). The Workshop III should be in Ljubljana, and it will cover the Data Seal of Approval (DSA), the assessment tool used by CESSDA to ensure that its members apply best practices in digital data preservation. Each participant will evaluate the steps that will need to be taken for them to satisfy the requirements of the DSA. The workshop will also cover important questions concerning data security and backup, from technical and conceptual viewpoints. After the swap, the Ljubljana workshop could be on the second or third week of February, and the Zagreb workshop will be at autumn 2016. We concluded that this order is better, having in mind participants' needs for practical knowledge of data curation, in line with the RRPP project.
